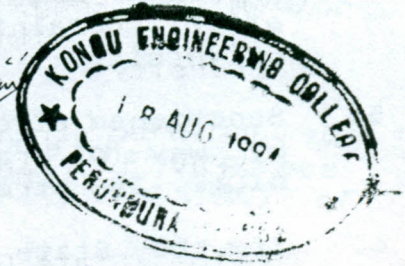

Sub: AICTE approval to Kongu Engg. College, Perundurai to conduct Engineering Courses.

Sir,

I am directed to state that on consideration of the recommendations made by the Expert Committee, the All India Council for Technical Education has accorded conditional approval to the Kongu Engg. College, Perundurai to conduct the following full time two additional Degree courses for the academic year 1994-95 with annual intake shown against each :

SL. NO.	NAME OF THE COURSE	INTAKE	Duration
1.	Chemical Engg.	40 (forty)	4 years
2.	Electrical & Electronics Engg.	40 (forty)	4 years

The above approval is subject to the fulfilment of specific conditions as under :-

1. The Management should establish the necessary laboratories required for Chemical Engg. and Electrical & Electronics Engg. before May 1995 besides separate other laboratories for the college. The basic Science laboratories now being shared with the Polytechnic students have to be exclusively established for Engg. college in view of the increase in intake.
2. In view of this increased intake recommended in this report, the College has to plan its own laboratories to cater to the needs of the college for its intake.

3. Admissions for the new courses at the first year level can however be made during the year 1994-95 since the scheme of instruction and examination is common for all the branches. No admission should be made into the second year for new courses for the academic year 1994-95.
4. The students should be admitted to the new courses i.e. Chemical Engg. and Electrical and Electronics Engg. only after obtaining the affiliation from the concerned university.
5. Sanctioned strength of any branch should not be altered even by way of branch transfers without the prior approval of AICTE. The strength of any branch should not exceed 60.
6. If the State Govt. has a proposal for increase in intake during 1994-95 session for consideration of AICTE, the recommended intake considered in this report should be adjusted against the proposed increase in intake considering State as a unit.
7. The deficiencies pointed out by the Expert Committee should be rectified immediately and the Management should submit the Compliance Report for the same to AICTE.
8. The AICTE will examine the compliance of the various aspects pointed out by the Committee at the end of the academic year 1994-95.
9. An Expert Committee of AICTE will visit the Instt. before the commencement of the admissions for academic year 1995-96 for review of infrastructural facilities created by the College for introduction of new courses in Chemical Engg. and Electrical & Electronics Engg.
10. The college should strictly follow any other conditions laid down by the AICTE from time to time.
11. The institute should also comply with the other conditions of AICTE as per annexure to this letter.


The approval is further subject to full compliance with the SCHEME as prescribed by the Supreme Court in its Judgement dated 4.2.1993 with regard to WP(C) No.607 of 1992 in the case of Unni Krishnan, UP and others etc. etc., Vs State of Andhra Pradesh and others etc., and later Judgements, and the related guidelines and criteria as may be issued by the AICTE, UGC or the Central Government from time to time.



In the event of non-compliance of the guidelines, norms and conditions prescribed by the AICTE, the AICTE or a body or person(s) authorised by it shall be free to take measures for withdrawal of the approval or recognition, without consideration of any related issues and that liabilities arising out of such withdrawal would be solely that of the Trust/Society and/or institution.

You are requested to kindly take necessary action to implement the decision of the AICTE and communicate the progress made in this regard to the Southern Regional Committee (SRC) of the AICTE under intimation to this office.


